n the 5th phase, we distributed 420 pcs of blankets and 69 pcs of Tarpaulins to affected communities in West Rukum namely: 3 wards of Banfikot Rural Municipality and 2 wards Musikot Rural Municipality and Sanibheri Rural Municipality.







Radio Distribution

he Jajarkot earthquake resulted into huge loss of lives and property. The earthquake survivors are facing trauma and other mental health challenges. They lost their family members, they saw the devastation in front of their eyes. A local FM radio station started a weekly programme to provide psychosocial counseling to the survivors. Help Nepal has already distributed 200 pc of radio sets to people in the affected areas including in the Kushe Rural Municipality.







Construction of Temporary Learning Center(TLC) at Indradhanush School, Jajarkot

November n 3, 2023, a 6.4 magnitude earthouake hit Jajarkot and West Rukum in West Nepal, resulting in serious damage to houses and schools. The classroom was severely damaged by the earthquake, forcing students to study in the open ground during the cold winter.So, we decided to support towards the construction of temporary classes learning for students of Indradhanush School, Jajarkot so that the students could have proper

classrooms to study. On January 31, 2024, an MOU was signed between Help Nepal Network and Shree Indra Dhanush School, Jajarkot, to facilitate the construction of a temporary learning center. The school management committee completed this project within a month. They have worked effectively to ensure that the students get proper classes to study as soon as possible. We are truly grateful for all the donors who made this possible.

LONG TERMPROJECTS

HELP NEPAL Network Children's Home, Dhulikhel

ELP NEPAL Children's Home is one of the major projects undertaken by the HELP NEPAL Network (HeNN). Dhulikhel Children's Home is providing a safe environment and education to 23 girls of different ages and from different backgrounds until the age of 18. HeNN has been providing them safe accommodation, which facilitates their development in becoming independent women. Including their ability to make decisions, live independently, be employed, or employ others, thereby

contributing fully to the future of Nepal.

The children actively participate in both academic and extracurricular

activities in school. The tuition classes are conducted from 6 am to 8 am to help improve the education outcomes of the children. In December 2023, Dhulikhel Municipality donated 450 pcs of sanitary pads to our girls. During holidays, girls were given training to make solid and liquid soap. Sapana Praja, a student at the Children's Home, was selected for 3 week-long National Cadet Corps (NCC) training conducted by Nepali Army. She spent 3 weeks camping at Bardibas. The residential training is organised to help develop exemplary qualities of discipline, brotherhood, secular mindset, and bravery among youth. Similarly, an organisation called Nabil Hub trained the children to make drawings and also donated Nrs. 4,000 for the endowment fund. Some members of the local community came to celebrate their birthdays with girls which brought happiness to our girls.

On 7th March, their English teacher who was taking online classes came to visit the girls. She brought bags, dresses, and customized pouches to the girls. The girls were really happy to see their teacher, Louise, face to face. She stayed with the girls and had a small celebration at our children's home. Mr Prashidha Pradham of HeNN UK chapter, also visited the Children's Home.

One aim of the visit was to ensure that the girls are thriving as well as igniting self-belief and energy in their thinking. We had a birthday party for everybody.

Help Nepal Health Post

NEPAL. Health ELP Post in MurThe HELP NEPAL Health Post in Murma, Mugu- one of the remotest districts in the country, was established in June 2004. Over the last two decades, the Health Post has had a discernibly positive impact on the lives of not just the locals but also those from surrounding villages. Common ailments like pain, fever, and gastrointestinal and seasonal diseases can now be treated locally. There has been a significant improvement in the quality of life and

villagers don't have to walk two and a half hours to reach the governmentrun hospital at Gamgadhi.

More than 80,000 people have been treated to date in the health post. Help Nepal Health Post provided health facilities and regular checkups to patients who were facing various health issues such as common cold, cough, fever, stomach pain, joint pain, PNC/ANC check up for pregnant women, and skin diseases. The health post has been providing basic health facilities with necessary checkups and treatments to local residents and trekkers who pass along that route. Additionally, the health post has provided the local citizens with significant relief packages for its residents. The Health Post was instrumental in raising awareness and provided hand sanitisers and masks to local residents there during the Covid pandemic. Importantly, the health post has been providing necessary checkups and treatment for local and foreign tourists as per their needs.

elp Nepal Health Post Rara, Mugu has been doing health camps along with different activities every month. On 1st December, 2023, Help Nepal Health Post organized a health camp in collaboration with the Pokhara Lions Club. One day health camp was organised at Chhayanath, Rara Municipality ward No 9 of Murma village. In this health camp, the general health checkup was conducted for 121 people who came from surrounding areas. Medicines were also provided as per their need.

s part of the m o n t h l y outreach clinic, On January 5th, 2024, Help Nepal Health Post organized a health camp in collaboration with the District Health Office, Mugu. The camp was held at Chhayanath, Rara Municipality ward 9 Murma village. Health Post organized a mobile health camp as the distance between the District Health Office and the village is around 5 hours. In this camp, pregnant women had their regular health checkups along with video x-rays to check the health of the mother and their baby.

February

Health camp at Mahadev primary School

n the month of February, many people from Karnali P r o v i n c e , M u g u were suffering from viral fever and common cold. At least 3 people from Mugu District, Soru rural municipality lost their lives due to viral fever and common cold. On February 7th, 2024, Help Nepal Health Post organised a health camp at Mahadev Primary School, which is located at Chhayanath Rara Municipality Ward no 8, Mugu District. Free health check was conducted for students of class 1 to 5 and as well as local residents. The staff of the Health Post made local residents aware about the common cold and fever and also provided them medicines.



Measles-Rubella Vaccination Campaign

March 2024. n Help Nepal Health Post successfully organised Measles-Rubella Vaccination Campaign at different places. The government conducted Measles-Rubella Vaccination Campaign in 24 districts where 21 districts were from terai region and remaining 3 districts were Kathmandu, Bhaktapur and Lalitpur. In these districts, children from 9 months up to 15

years were vaccinated. In Mugu district of Karnali Province, children from 5 months to below 5 years were vaccinated. Help Nepal Health Post Mugu collaborated with Chhayanath Rara municipality and successfully conducted the vaccination campaign in ward no 8 and 9 of the municipality. A total of 83 children - including 46 girls, were vaccinated.

The running cost of its Kathmandu-based three-member office and other administrative expenses are borne by a separate Endowment Fund (known as a Trust Fund in Nepal) set up by the Network with the help of generous Nepali donors living in various parts of the world. This fund allows the Network to spend every single penny donated directly on the projects it undertakes. All executive committee members and coordinators working in many different chapters are volunteers.

The aim of the Network is to encourage Nepalis and those who love Nepal around the world to provide assistance in the fields of health, education and disaster relief support in rural Nepal. We envision a society where every relatively able individual contributes a small portion of their earnings for the benefit of those who genuinely need support. We have called this 'Practical Philanthropy', an approach which will not hamper an individual's normal life but which will benefit disadvantaged communities. It is estimated that there are 3 million Nepalese staying abroad. The numbers of Nepali institutions alone are in thousands. Some may be able to give more than we expect, some less.
