SHORT TERM PROJECTS



Relief Materials Support to Fire Victims of Khotang and Saptari

n April 26, 2024, fire broke Halesi out in Tuwachung Municipality, Ward No.9, Khotang District, affecting 6 residences and 30 family members from marginalized groups.The forest fire spread to the village of Khotang district, destroying about 6 houses. This made it extremely difficult for them to make a living. Help Nepal Network supported fire victims by providing relief materials.

On April 26, 2024, two villages in Saptari district were completely destroyed by a massive fire. 16 houses at Sardar tole -5, Kanchanrup Municipality and 14 houses at Mahadev Rural Municipality were totally damaged due to the fire. A total of 30 families became homeless and needed urgent help .Help Nepal Network extended support to the fire victims of Spatrai District by providing Tarpaulins and Zinc Sheets.













School Bag Support to the students of Shree Nepal Rastriya Basic School, Parsa

n 19th May 2024, Help Nepal Network donated 300 school bags to the students of Shree Nepal Rastriya Basic School located at Belwa, Paterwa, Sugauli Rural Municipality-2, Parsa, Nepal. So, while they begin their new academic session we decided to support the 300 students with the school bags.

HELP NEPAL Network Children's Home, Dhulikhel

ELP NEPAL Children's Home is one of the major projects undertaken by HELP NEPAL Network (HeNN). Dhulikhel Children's Home is providing a safe environment and education to 24 girls of different ages and from different backgrounds. HeNN has been providing them education and skills along with safe accommodation, which facilitates their development in becoming independent women. Including their ability to make decisions, live independently, be employed, or employ others, thereby contributing fully to the future of Nepal.

The children actively participate in both academic and extracurricular activities in school. The tuition classes are conducted from 6 am to 8 pm to help improve education outcomes of the children. As the girls were very excited for music class we continued giving music class in April. They also continued dance class and Taekwondo class.

Help Nepal Health Post, Mugu

he HELP NEPAL Health Post in Murma, Muguone of the remotest districts in the country, was established in June 2004. Over the last two decades, the Health Post has had a discernibly positive impact on the lives of not just the locals but also those from surrounding villages. Common ailments like pain, fever, and gastrointestinal and seasonal diseases can now be treated locally. There has been a significant improvement in the quality of life and villagers don't have to walk two and a half hours to reach the government-run hospital at Gamgadhi.

More than 85,000 people have been treated to date in the health post. Help Nepal Health Post provided health facilities and regular checkups to patients who were facing various health issues such as common cold, cough, fever, stomach pain, joint pain, PNC/ANC check up for pregnant women, and skin diseases. The health post has been providing basic health facilities with necessary checkups and treatments to local residents and trekkers who pass along that route. Additionally, the health post has provided the local citizens with significant relief packages for its residents. The Health Post was instrumental in raising awareness and provided hand sanitisers and masks to local residents there during the Covid pandemic. Importantly, the health post has been providing necessary checkups and treatment for local and foreign tourists as per their needs.

Dental Health Camp in collaboration with Kathmandu University Dhulikhel Hospital

very month, Help Nepal Health Post has been organizing different outreach programs. On 2nd and 3rd of April 2024, Help Nepal Health Post, Mugu, organized a dental camp at Chayanath Municipality, Rara in collaboration with Kathmandu University Dhulikhel Hospital which was conducted for 2 days. A total 280 local people and patients including 176 male and 104 female benefited from the dental camp.

very month Help Nepal Health Post Rara, Mugu has been organizing different outreach programs. In April 2024, staff from Help Nepal Health Post paid home visits to residents of Chhayanaath municipality, ward no 9 and provided vitamin A and hookworm medicine to the children of the village. They were also provided with the BCG vaccine. The Health Assistant at the Health Post provided advice and service to mothers of children regarding sexual health and family planning.







Intensive Eye Camp with support from Tilganga Eye Foundation, Kathmandu and National Health Fund, SWC

elp Nepal Health Post, Mugu Help Nepal Health post organized a free Eye Camp with the support from Tilganga Eye Centre, Kathmandu and National Health Fund, SWC, Bhrikutimandap from June 16 to June 18, 2024. Around 600 individuals received treatment at the Help Nepal Health Post Majghatta, Rara Mugu for various eye-related conditions. Among these, 28 individuals had cataract eye surgery.







Shree Panchakanya Basic School, Kavre

elp Nepal Network Nepal signed an agreement with Shree Panchakanya Secondary School located in Kavre on 13 June 2024. Help Nepal Network has been providing financial support to 4 english medium teachers of Shree Panchakanya School every year. HeNN has also been providing English books from Nursery to Grade 5 students for the past few years. This year also we continued this support and signed an agreement with Shree Panchakanya Basic School in the presence of Mr. Arun Shrestha, Education Coordinator of HeNN and Mr Prakash Humagain, Principal of Shree Panchakanya Basic School.

All executive committee members and coordinators working in many different chapters are volunteers.

The aim of the Network is to encourage Nepalis and those who love Nepal around the world to provide assistance in the fields of health, education and disaster relief support in rural Nepal.
